Dunderdale breaks Schools' County

record



Boston, Lincolnshire; 11 June, 2011 – Carre's Year 13 student, Joe Dunderdale, smashed the Lincolnshire Schools' javelin record with a throw measuring 69.23 metres at the Boston Athletics Stadium. Little did those present realise, but this was to be the start an incredible run of performances by the young man from Caythorpe.

Joe wasn't satisfied with that achievement alone: instead he went on to win again the very next day, securing the first prize of a brand new Nordic javelin in the process! That event doubled as the Great Britain qualifying event for the European Championships and Joe threw an enormous personal best of 72.55 metres. To put this achievement into perspective, consider that this was the 7th longest throw EVER by a British athlete under 20 years of age. Joe's throw was also the 6th best this year by any British athlete, regardless of age!

Year 11: Charlie Rossington


Charlie has had an extremely impressive season, resulting in regular call-ups to the Under 18 squad, one year ahead of schedule.




OLYMPIC COUNTDOWN AT CARRE'S

CARRE'S CSI DAY

It was the 28th of June and the lads from Carre's Grammar school were ready for the return of Jacqui Thompson and her team, to train the boys how to become Forensic Scientists. It was CSI day. The event took place in the Northgate Sports Hall, run by PULSE Education & Business Services represented by Jacqui Thompson and organised by Ms Hobbs and Mr Wright! PULSE Education & Business Services combined their skills to develop a range of unique and authentic CSI activities for children and young adults. The team includes highly dedicated professionals including lead crime scene examiners specialising in Forensic Science.

After registration it was out on to the playground to be split up from friends. There were two purposes: the first obviously learning how to become a Forensic Scientist, but also to make new friends and spend time with people you don't know too well. This is another life skill: enabling you to work with almost anyone. After team leaders were arranged, it was into the Hall, and the day began.

Students from previous years had told the current year 9 students how interesting and memorable the day was, which led the 120 pupils to enthusiastically anticipate the day ahead of them. During the morning, time was allocated to learning various techniques, which the boys would have to use later if they were to be successful in their own crime scene investigation. These techniques included: iron filing finger prints, aluminium foil finger prints, lifting gel and UV lighting and swabbing liquids. However, it was useless if you were to just learn the techniques and therefore we were taught how to engage our brains, to consider various crime scene possibilities.

The afternoon arrived quickly and it was time to change into the SOCO suits (Scene of Crime Officer). Each team had 45 minutes to discover and collect as much evidence as possible. Teams collected a number of different pieces of evidence which ranged from hair to fingerprints. The students then concocted up a theory based on their findings. So taking into account as much **evidence** as possible, I can conclude it was a very interesting and enjoyable day!
